

Dr. Georgia Nemetz is the retired Chief of Psychology at the Royal Columbian Hospital, a post which she held for 25 years.

She serves as a major resource to the Vancouver Police Department, B.C. Transit Police, West Vancouver Police and the R.C.M.P. providing staff services, critical incident debriefing, hostage negotiation consultation, educational seminars and recruiting assessments.

She is currently serving as a consultant to the Sheriff's Department and is on contract with BCEHS to provide clinical oversight and training to their CISM Team. In this role she is also the clinical triage professional for the province's paramedics.

Dr. Nemetz had the honour of accompanying the Vancouver Police Trauma Team to New York after 911 to assist with the debriefing of the first responders. She also provides debriefing services to WorkSafe B.C. and Coastal Health.

She maintains a large clinical practice and provides educational and motivational workshops to both the public and private sectors. More specifically her practice focuses on first responders in terms of dealing with vocational, familial and psychological issues. Post-traumatic stress and crisis management is also offered. Therapy is directive, short-term and concentrates on concrete problem-solving and coping skills strategies. Dr. Nemetz also provides Independent Medical Assessment services to numerous agencies.



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
