### Methodology

Field Window	July 22 – August 3, 2025
Sampling	Online and telephone survey of randomly selected sample of <b>704 Adult (18+) Newfoundland and Labrador Residents.</b>
Reliability	Non-probability samples (online) cannot be assigned a margin of error. *As a relative guideline, we have provided margins of error for a probability sample of this size.
Weighting	Data has been weighted using the most current gender, age, & region Census data, to ensure the sample reflects the actual population of adult Newfoundland and Labrador residents.




#### **DETAILED FINDINGS**



### Almost 4-in-5 Newfoundland & Labrador residents have favourable impression of RCMP officers

- Favourable impressions of RCMP officers increased from 75% to 79%, year over year
- Favourable impressions higher in RCMP-served areas (81%)
- 7-in-10 (70%) have favourable impression of Royal Newfoundland Constabulary (RNC)



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### Affordability/Cost-of-living and Health Care top list of priorities that respondents would like the Premier and government address

- Affordability and Cost-of-living (40%) and Health Care (36%) are top concerns, respectively, of over three-quarters of respondents. Health care has risen marginally (+4%) compared to 2024.
- Policing and public safety is top priority of 2% of respondents, the same level as 2024.

#### 4-in-5 in RCMP-served areas satisfied with RCMP's policing


- 80% of respondents who say they are served by RCMP are satisfied with RCMP policing, including 30% who are very satisfied
- 63% of respondents who say they are served by RNC are satisfied with RNC policing, including 21% who are very satisfied

#### Satisfaction with RCMP policing highest among men and 60+


Satisfaction with RCMP policing is high across types of communities, gender, and age groups





## Majority satisfied with RNC policing across community, gender, and age groups


Higher satisfaction among men and 60+ age group





### **RCMP:** Responding to natural disasters, positive example to young people, and local policing are top 3 of 12 metrics tested


- 77% of men, 81% of 60+ age group rate response to natural disasters as excellent/good
- Local policing is 3<sup>rd</sup> highest excellent/good score (60%), an increase of 7% compared to 2024
- Effectively dealing with those with mental health and/or addiction issues is split between excellent/good (38%) and poor/very poor job (23%), though this is an improvement compared to 2024 (+5% excellent/good)
- The average score across 12 metrics is 52% (excellent/good job), an increase of 3% compared to 2024.





### **RNC:** Responding to natural disasters, positive example to young people, and local policing are top 3 of 12 metrics tested


- Top 3 metrics in same order as RCMP-served communities, but excellent/good ratings are significantly lower than 2024 levels
- Local policing is third-rated metric (44%), but a decrease (-4%) compared to 2024, and lower than RCMP-served areas (60%)
- Effectively dealing with those with mental health and/or addiction issues is split between excellent/good (20%) and poor/very poor job (33%). Compared to 2024, excellent/good decreased by 5%.
- The average score across 12 metrics is 37% (excellent/good job), a decrease of 3% compared to 2024.





### Almost 7-in-10 in RCMP-served areas say RCMP patrolling presence and police visibility is very or somewhat present

- Visibility level for RCMP-served communities decreased (-4%) while visibility increased in RNC-served areas (+2%)
- Urban areas more likely to say police services are present compared to rural areas




#### PROVINCIAL POLICE REVIEW



### 1-in-3 choose "maintain current police system as is – no change"; more prefer increased role for RCMP than RNC


- Men more likely to favour status quo (38%) than women (29%); women more likely to favour increased role for RCMP (35%)
- Increased role for RCMP (37%) strongest in rural areas; status quo more top option in urban and suburban (30-34%)
- Older residents (60+) split between increased role for RCMP (36%) and status quo (35%); 40-59 age group more likely of age groups to favour increased role for RNC (29%)

### Almost two-thirds want Hogan government to "make it very clear" their plans for policing in their campaign platform


- Only 1-in-5 (20%) prefer to trust Premier Hogan and government to "make the correct decision about who polices the province without requiring much public engagement"
- NL Liberal voters want policing plans made "very clear" in platform by 2:1 margin (61% very clear, 31% trust Premier/govt)
- Preference to see policing plans in campaign platform consistent among gender and age groups



<sup>21.</sup> Upon taking office earlier this year, Premier John Hogan said his government would take a hard look at policing in Newfoundland & Labrador with a view to increasing the role of the RNC and expanding its service province-wide. ### RCMP extensive experience and federal subsidy for policing drive support for increasing role of the RCMP

- Rural and remote experience highest among 60+ (73%). It is the top message among 18-39s (66%).
- With modified wording, "federal government pays for 30% of cost of RCMP policing" increased from 57% (2024) to 67% (2025) in terms of driving support for increased RCMP role.
- RCMP modern technology and expertise is top message among 40-59s (67%).



## Budget priorities: Plurality says RCMP and RNC-served areas should be given same funding priority; more prioritize RCMP over RNC


- Combined 74% say higher priority should be given to RCMP-served areas (35%) or RCMP-served and RNC-served areas should be given same priority (39%)
- Rural and 60+ respondents more likely to say RCMP-served areas should be given a higher priority



<sup>22.</sup> In the 2025-2026 provincial budget tabled by the Liberal government earlier this spring, additional funding was provided for 10 new RNC officers but no new funding for RCMP officers. Between 2019-2023, there was a 12% increase in the number of calls for service in RCMP-served areas and an 8% increase in the number of calls for service in RNC-served areas. ### **POST-TEST:** increased role for RCMP increases 10% after statements are reviewed

- Support for increased role for RCMP increases 10% from pre-test (30%) to post-test (40%), while support for increasing RNC role decreases by 5% from pre-test (23%) to post-test (18%).
- About 3-in-10 (29%) of those preferring increased RNC role on pre-test moved to increased RCMP role in post-test



# NL residents agree that there should be a detailed accounting of costs and impacts to service levels before any changes to local policing, including majority that strongly agree

- Over 9-in-10 (91%) say there are more important priorities to deal with in Newfoundland & Labrador right now than changing who polices local communities, including 61% that strongly agree.
- About 9-in-10 (87%) agree, and majority (61%) strongly agree, that "given the threat from Donald Trump ... we need to strengthen our national institutions, like the RCMP, not weaken them"




